



SURVEY METHODOLOGY

- ONLINE SURVEY OF 1,100 RESIDENTS AGED 17+
- 300 HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS
- 800 CONTINUING PSE STUDENTS
- APRIL 23 MAY 1, 2020
- WEIGHTED TO MATCH THE CANADIAN POPULATION BY AGE, GENDER, REGION, OFFICIAL LANGUAGE, INSTITUTION TYPE
- MARGIN OF ERROR: <u>+</u> 3.0%, 19 TIMES OUT OF 20









HOW DOES THIS IMPACT FACULTY?

- 1. STUDENTS ARE UNCERTAIN ABOUT WHAT TO DO IN THE FALL.
- 2. NEGATIVE ECONOMIC IMPACT ON 70%+. MOST ACUTE FOR 30-40%.
- 3. DROP IN ENROLMENT COULD BE AS HIGH AS 30%, BUT MORE LIKELY 4% RO 6%.
