Re: Librarian Salary Survey (2017/18-2019/20) - Deadline extended

In light of the public health emergency, CAUT has extended the deadline for the Librarian Salary Survey until **June 1, 2020**.

This survey is of nationwide importance, providing valuable data for collective bargaining and advocacy for academic and professional librarians working in university and college libraries. Much of the information collected in the survey is not available from other sources, making it vital that we receive the broadest national participation possible.

The survey has been shortened from previous years, focusing on salary information. Information previously requested on academic and trade union status will continue to be collected by CAUT through different survey instruments.

Who Should Complete the Questionnaire?

Association staff or volunteers typically complete the survey drawing on information provided to the association by the administration. A librarian representative may be best placed to acquire this data in some cases, and to assist with the completion of the survey. A copy of your association's response from the past survey can be provided upon request.

If librarians are not members of your bargaining unit or association, please forward the survey questionnaire to an appropriate person at your institution's library (most likely the Chief Librarian), and notify us accordingly.
